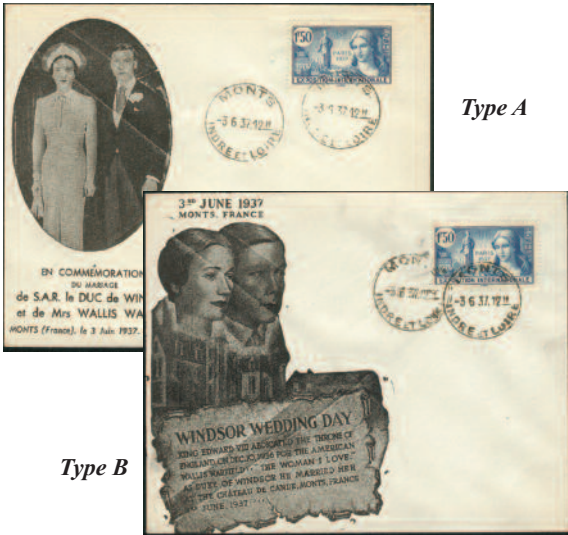

A RUSH EXCLUSIVE FROM NEW YORK!



Recently discovered in the attic of a brownstone property in Manhattan during renovation work, 45 editions of the London "The Daily News" were found and were dated 1863/1864. These newspapers were mailed to Messrs. Brown Brothers & Co., a firm of Investment Bankers in New York. Unusually 3 of the same paper were mailed from the port of Liverpool to New York and there the very first Great Britain 3d Queen Victoria stamp was issued in 1862. The stamp is stuck to the top of the newspaper and is cancelled with the numeral '466' postmark which denotes Liverpool. The rate for mailing newspapers at that time was just one penny and therefore it is very rare to find a newspaper with the 3d denomination. The stamp has a catalogue reference of SG 76 and is catalogued as used on cover at £600 however, this rare usage for newspapers must be limited to only a few against many, many, thousands of normal letters.....Christmas Special PRICE ~~£150.00~~ £85.00 each
