1971 CROYDON - GATWICK STRIKE MAIL


During the National Postal dispute of 1971 the Croydon/Gatwick postal service was inaugurated to carry overseas mail by container from Gatwick Airport to Amsterdam where it was fed into the Dutch postal system. In addition there was a 5p value depicting a seated Britannia, this stamp being for local mail.

Rough Perforation - These perforations are of a crude sewing machine type, with the paper being pierced without being punched out. The lines of perforation are often uneven.

Roulette - Some large format stamps issued in sheetlets of 6 were rouletted, horizontally and vertically. In some cases the margins were rouletted and in other cases were left imperforate. **Line Perforation -** The final printings of this series were line perforated, horizontally and vert
